Purpose, Audience, Form

<u>P.A.F</u>

Before writing a text it is important to identify the purpose, your audience and the required form. This will help you choose what language and structure to use in your writing,

Purpose

It is vital that you achieve your purpose, think "Why am I writing?"

- Argue/ Persuade
- Describe
- Entertain
- Inform, Explain, Advise
- Instruct

The purpose of the text will affect the language and structure you use. For example the language in a persuasive advert is completely different to a formal letter.

Audience

You must tailor your writing to suit your audience, Think "Who am I writing to?"

- Friends
- Children
- Teacher
- Potential employers
- Politician

The nature of your audience will have a big impact on the language and tone you use in your writing. For example the language used in an article for a children's magazine will be different to that used in a scientific journal.

Form (text type)

Your writing needs to be presented in a suitable form. Think "How am i going to present and structure my writing?" You will often be asked to write a specific type of text.
